1.2 Handling the product

The product described in this Quick Start Guide left the factory in a perfect and tested state in terms of safety. To maintain this state and to achieve a perfect and safe operation of this product, it may only be operated in the manner described by the manufacturer. In addition, the perfect and safe operation of this product requires correct transportation, proper storage and careful operation.

1.3 Intended use

1.3.1 Exclusive purpose

The Mobile Computer is a handheld piece of electrical equipment. It serves the purpose of the mobile recording, processing and/or radio transmission of data within potentially explosive atmospheres.

It is used exclusively in combination with devices which comply with the requirements placed on the overvoltage category I.

The admissible operating data of the device used must be considered.

1.3.2 Unintended use

Any other use is unintended and may lead to damage and accidents. The manufacturer shall not be liable for any use extending beyond the exclusive purpose.

1.4 Duties of the operator

The operator undertakes to only permit persons to work with the Mobile Computer who

- are acquainted with the basic regulations on safety and accident prevention, and who have been inducted in the use of the Mobile Computer,
- have read and understood the documentation, the safety chapter and the warnings.

The operator checks that the safety and accident prevention regulations applicable to the respective case of use have been observed.

1.5 Safety information

- Do not dry wipe or clean devices in potentially explosive atmospheres!

2 **Product description**

2.1 MC93^{ex}-NI

The MC93^{ex}-NI is a tough Mobile Computer with 4.3" color display, which has been designed for use in the industrial environments and especially developed by BARTEC in close cooperation with ZEBRA for use in potentially explosive atmospheres.



2.2 Purpose of use

The Mobile Computer MC93^{ex}-NI are handheld electrical devices. They serve the purpose of entry, processing and (radio) transmission of data within potentially explosive atmospheres.

The Mobile Computer MC93^{ex}-NI are used exclusively in combination with devices which comply with the requirements placed on the overvoltage category I.

The **Mobile Computer MC93**^{ex}-NI, Type B7-A2M*-****/**** have been modified for use in the following potentially explosive atmospheres:

- ATEX / IECEx Zone 2 and Zone 22




Charge the batteries at temperatures from 0°C to 40°C (32°F to 104°F). The device or charging station always performs the battery charging in a safe and intelligent way. At higher temperatures, such as about +37°C (+98°F), the device or charging station can alternately activate and deactivate battery charging for a short time to keep the battery at acceptable temperatures. The device and the charging station indicate via their LED when charging is disabled due to abnormal temperatures.

5.2 Storage

ATTENTION

Property damage through incorrect storage!

- Observe storage temperatures.
- ► Keep humidity away from the Mobile Computer.

Additional information on the batteries

The batteries from BARTEC (Type B7-A2Z0-0059) are developed and manufactured in accordance with the highest industrial standards. The operating time or storage period of a battery is restricted, however. The actual life of a battery is influenced by different factors, e.g. hot, cold, rough operating environment and falling from a great height. If a battery is kept longer than six months, the performance may be impaired on a permanent basis. Keep the batteries in a dry, cool place. For longer periods of storage, remove the batteries from the device to prevent self-discharge, rusting of the metallic and the escape of electrolyte.

Batteries kept for a duration of six months or longer should be charged and discharged again at least every three months. If electrolyte has escaped, do not touch the areas affected and dispose of the batteries as prescribed. Replace the battery if the operating time has shortened considerably.

6 Commissioning

A DANGER

Avoid electrostatic charging in potentially explosive atmosphere. Danger to life in explosive atmosphere!

- ► Do not dry wipe or clean the devices.
- ► Wear suitable clothing and shoes.
- ► Do not use rubber gloves or similar.

A DANGER

Unintended use endangers explosion protection. Danger to life in explosive atmosphere!

- ▶ Do not make any changes to the Mobile Computer.
- In the case of function disturbances or damage to the enclosure, the device should be removed immediately from the potentially explosive atmosphere to a safe place. Remove battery to decommission the device!
- ▶ Do not use any battery replicas or batteries from other manufacturers.

6.1 Requirements in potentially explosive atmosphere

Mobile Computer

- The Mobile Computer may not be opened.
- Do not use, swap or replace any non-specified components.
- Do not retrofit any components to the internal plugs or slots. Exception: SD-card
- Protect the Mobile Computer from impact!
- Do not expose the Mobile Computer to caustic/aggressive liquids, vapours, mists!
- Avoid the impact of moisture outside the specifications.
- Avoid thermal impact outside the specified temperature range.
- Use the 9-pole data interface only outside the potentially explosive atmosphere and exclusively with the devices specified by the manufacturer!

Battery

- The battery may not be opened.
- Only charge the battery (Type B7-A2Z0-0059) outside the potentially explosive atmosphere.
- To charge the battery, the charging temperature must be between 0°C and 40°C (32°F and 104°F).
- Only use the battery for the purpose listed in this Quick Start Guide. Is only suitable for the Mobile Computer Type B7-A2M*-****/****
- The battery must be locked within the potentially explosive atmosphere.
- There is a danger of burning if used incorrectly. Do not expose the battery to temperatures of more than +50 °C (+122 °F).
- Defective batteries must be disposed of immediately, whereby the provisions on battery disposal applicable in the respective region must be observed.
- The battery may explode if it catches fire!
- Do not short circuit the battery!

Accessories

- Only install or replace accessories outside the potentially explosive atmosphere.
- User accessories exclusively which have been tested or certified by BARTEC for this purpose.
- The end user can replace the Micro SD card, screen protector, keypad, leather holster and handstrap himself.

7 Operation

7.1 Handling accessories

Non certified accessories endanger explosion protection.

Danger to life exists in potentially explosive atmospheres!

Only use original accessories from BARTEC.

Only permitted outside the potentially explosive atmosphere:

- ► Insert/charge battery.
- ► Insert/replace microSD card.
- Attach/remove accessories such as Micro SD card, screen protector, keypad, leather holster and handstrap.


7.1.1 Insert/change battery

The MC93^{ex}–NI is supplied with a battery:

Insert battery - work steps:

- 1. Charge the battery only outside hazardous areas.
- 2. The battery (Type B7-A2Z0-0059) may only be inserted/changed outside the hazardous area.
- 3. Use only batteries which have been tested or certified by BARTEC for this purpose.
- 4. Insert the battery with the battery contacts facing forwards into the battery compartment under the keypad.
- 5. Make sure that the battery's charging contacts agree with the charging contacts in the battery compartment.
- 6. Push the battery into the battery compartment until it locks into place.




Change battery - work steps:

The device provides a Hot Swap mode where you can replace the battery without powering off the device. When you remove the battery, the display turns off and the devices enters the Hot Swap mode. WLAN and Bluetooth connectivity are retained for the first 30 seconds (indicated by a flashing amber LED). After 30 seconds, the device enters a critical suspend mode with RAM data persistence for approximately 5 minutes. In the critical suspend mode, WLAN and Bluetooth radios are disabled and will only resume if you insert a battery with sufficient charge into the device.




- If the battery change takes longer than 5 minutes, switch off the MC93ex-NI with function "Power Off" before removing the battery. Mistakes when removing the battery can cause data loss.
- To prevent damage to the device, DO NOT perform a hot swap during a device boot up session.
- The supercap requires time to recharge after performing a Hot Swap or after the main battery is fully depleted. It can take up to 15 minutes to fully charge the supercap. Hot Swap mode will not retain data
- If the change does not take longer than 5 minutes, the battery can be changed during operation (hot swap). Otherwise switch off the Mobile Computer MC93ex-NI with function "Power Off".
- 2. The battery (type B7-A2Z0-0059) may only be inserted/changed outside the hazardous area.
- 3. Use only batteries which have been tested or certified by BARTEC for this purpose.
- 4. To remove the battery, first unlock the side battery lock.




5. Then unlock the battery lock.



6. Remove the battery from the Mobile Computer.



7. Insert a new battery.



7.1.2 Change keypad

The Mobile Computer MC93^{ex}–NI has interchangeable modular keypads.

🛦 DANGER







4. Slide the keypad latches toward the bottom of the device.




- 5. Turn the device over so that the keypad is visible.
- 6. Remove the two keypad assembly screws from the top of the keypad.




7. Lift the keypad from the Mobile Computer.

8. Take the new keypad and align it along the bottom ridge of the device, and then lay it flat.




9. Secure the keypad to the device using the two screws. (torque = 0.56 Nm / torque = 5.0 lbf in)




10. Turn the device over so that the keypad latches are visible.

7.1.3 Insert microSD card






- 1. Only install or replace the microSD card outside the potentially explosive atmosphere.
- Only use microSD cards which have been tested and specified by BARTEC for this purpose.
- 3. Press the red button "ON/OFF" to suspend the Mobile Computer.
- 4. Remove the battery (see chapter "Insert/change battery")
- 5. Remove the keypad screws and slide the keypad down and lift off (see chapter "Change keypad").
- 6. Slide the microSD card holder to the Open position.








8. Insert the microSD card into the card holder door ensuring that the card slides into the holding tabs on each side of the door.






7.1.4.1 In Base station

7.1.4.2 In Charging adapter for older Docking Station


1. Clean the contacts and surfaces of the Docking station with an alcohol wipe.





7.1.5 Charging the spare battery


7.1.5.1 In Base station

- 1. Ensure that the Base station is connected to power.
- 2. Insert the spare battery into the charging well, small end first, onto the contact pins.
- 3. Gently press down on the battery to ensure proper contact.



7.1.5.2 In 4-slot battery charging station

- 1. Ensure that the battery charging station is connected to power.
- 2. Insert up to 4 spare batteries into the charging well, small end first, onto the contact pins.
- 3. Gently press down on the battery to ensure proper contact.

7.2 Scanning

- 1. Ensure that an application is open on the device and a text field is in focus (text cursor in text field).
- 2. Point the top of the device at a barcode.
- Press and hold the Scan button or trigger. The red laser aiming pattern turns on to assist in aiming.
- Ensure the barcode is within the area formed by the cross-hairs in the aiming pattern. The aiming dot is used for increased visibility in bright lighting conditions. The Scan LEDs light green and a beep sounds, by default, to indicate the barcode was decoded successfully.


